Senator Sanders Applauds Little Rivers Health Care in East Corinth, VT by Sarah Brubeck, Valley News Staff Writer

"In the waiting room of the Little Rivers Health Care clinic here, a sign on the freshly painted wall says, "Your federal tax dollars at work." Just in time for a visit by U.S. Sen. Bernie Sanders, I-Vt., a longtime advocate for small, rural clinics such as Little Rivers and two others it operates in the area, open to anyone who walks through their doors. The Little Rivers clinic qualified for \$485,900 in federal stimulus funds to renovate its 100-year-old building. Sanders, who recently voted against the deficit reduction deal because he found it "extremely unfair," said he's worried the funding that helped to refurbish the clinic may no longer be available when lawmakers begin making cuts.

Before the renovation, the clinic's building had no structural foundation and patients shivered in the waiting room because of drafty walls. The nurses' station was so cramped that whenever anyone opened the door, a nurse would hit her head on the wall. "It's a joke now, but it wasn't funny then," said Gail Auclair, CEO of Little Rivers Health Care.

In the United States, 50 million people don't have health insurance, Sanders said. The East Corinth clinic serves about 1,500 patients, while the combined Little Rivers Health Care serves about 8,500, Auclair said." Read the full article.
