The interactive educational program provided essential information and resources to 85 participants from community health centers in New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts and Connecticut. The training session addressed each of the report's tables and included a discussion of

the changes that have been made and the definitions necessary to complete the report. Health center staffs responsible for gathering and reporting the data elements, management and clinical staff who need to understand the definitions and concepts used, and those who use the data in their program management and quality improvement activities were in attendance.
